Dear Senator McBroom:

At the Houghton County Board of Commissioners meeting on May 11, 2021, the Board voted unanimously to request your Michigan Senate Oversight Committee to investigate the allegations contained in Michael Lindell's election documentary titled the *Absolute Truth*. This program aired on February 5, 2021 on the OAN network, and Houghton County was the 5th entity that was highlighted by Mr. Lindell (see Houghton County at the 1 Hour and 37 minute mark).

This claim has led to an overall questioning of election integrity for our County, and several members of our public came and Zoomed in to participate and question this at our most recent BOC meeting. Ours was one of several Counties that were mentioned in this documentary, and it alleged that 1,143 votes were changed here in our County for the recent November Presidential election on November 4, 2020. In our County President Trump received 10,378 votes to President Biden's 7,750 votes.

With this claim that votes were stolen from President Trump by Mr. Lindell, Attorney Matt DePerno, former Senator Patrick Colbeck and others, the public has asked us strongly to look into this matter. The County Board has continued to receive requests to have this matter looked at, and to conduct a possible forensic audit of the Dominion Machines and software--as that has been questioned and requested by many here since the Lindell documentary aired.

Therefore, the Houghton County Board of Commissioners formally requests that your Senate Oversight Committee consider opening up an investigation to determine and verify that our election results are 100% accurate and legitimate.

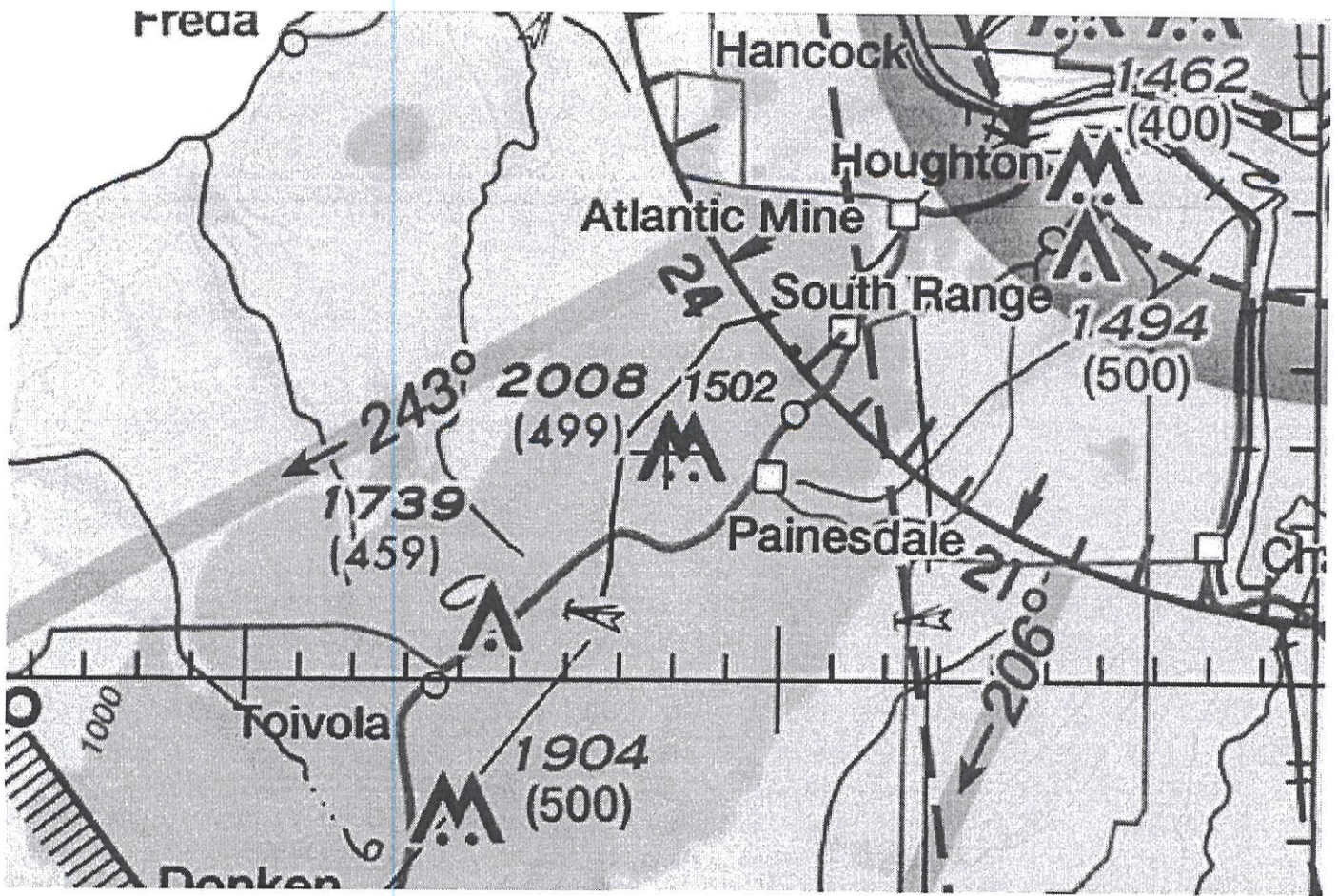
