PRIMARY ELECTION**

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS:

The Townships of: Adams, Calumet, Chassell, Duncan, Elm River, Franklin, Hancock, Laird, Osceola, Portage, Quincy, Schoolcraft, Stanton, Torch Lake and the Cities of Hancock and Houghton.

Notice is hereby given that a Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 2, 2022. The polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION:

For the purpose of nominating Democratic and Republican candidates for the following offices: Governor, 1st District Representative in Congress, 38th District Senator, 110th District Representative, Sheriff, Commissioners Districts 1-5, Quincy Township Trustee, Laird Township Supervisor, Quincy Township Supervisor, Stanton Township Supervisor, Calumet Township Clerk, 4th District Judge Court of Appeals, and Precinct Delegates.

Township Proposals:

Calumet Township:

ROAD MILLAGE RENEWAL

Shall the limitation of the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in the unincorporated areas in the Charter Township of Calumet be increased 1 ½ mills (\$ 1.50 per thousand of Taxable Value) for eight (8) years (2023, 2024, 2025, 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029, 2030) and the taxes so raised be used for road repair and road maintenance in the unincorporated areas in the Charter Township of Calumet, raising in the first year an estimated \$ 111, 409?

Osceola Township:

**RENEWAL OF ROAD, SIDEWALK, DRAINAGE
MILLAGE WITHIN OSCEOLA TOWNSHIP**

Shall a renewal of the road, sidewalk, drainage millage be imposed for 3 mills (\$3 per \$1,000 taxable value) in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for five (5) years, 2023 through 2027, inclusive for road, sidewalk, and drainage purposes which 3.0 mills will raise an estimated \$134,623.75 in 2023, the first year the renewed millage is levied? If approved, the monies collected from each voting precinct will be spent in that voting precinct.

Schoolcraft Township:

Road Millage Renewal

Shall the limitation of the total amount taxes which may be assessed against all unincorporated areas in the Township of Schoolcraft be renewed at the rate of 1.5 mills per taxable value for a period of 10 years (2022-2031), subject to applicable Headlee millage rollbacks and the taxes raised for road repair and improvement in the unincorporated areas of the Township of Schoolcraft raising in the first year an estimated \$43,200.00?

Road Millage

Shall the limitation of all taxes which may be assessed against all unincorporated area of the Township of Schoolcraft be increased at the rate of 1.5 mills per taxable value for a period of 10 years (2022-2031) subject to applicable Headlee millage rollbacks and the taxes raised for road repair and improvement in the unincorporated areas of Schoolcraft Township raising in the first year an estimated \$43,200.00?

Stanton Township:

STANTON TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION ORDINANCE

Ordinance 9 would establish the Stanton Township Planning Commission for the purpose of having planning and zoning in Stanton Township, to create, organize, enumerate powers and duties, and to provide for the regulation and subdivision of land. Shall this ordinance be approved?
